Wesley Connect, located on the ground floor, looks after people through their food and care program, that are homeless or are on low incomes and are doing it tough at the moment. All food (non-perishable) is donated.

For the first time in its three years of operation last month Wesley Connect has had empty shelves, barely getting by. On average Connect serves 80 people a week.

Can you imagine if even just half of the students from SFS donated 1 can or packet a week to this program what an impact that would have.

Most in need are tin fish or meat, chunky soups, long life milk, pasta sauce, tin fruit and pot noodles. Donations can be left at any day or direct to Connect Tues, Wed, Thurs.
