Supported access to quality aged care services for older people

Care finders can help older people understand what aged care services are available to them, conduct assessments, identify needs and access appropriate services.

To receive Wesley care finder support, an older person must:

- have no carer or support person who can help them
- have difficulty communicating because of language or literacy problems
- find it difficult to understand information or make decisions
- be reluctant to engage other aged care or government services
- be in an unsafe situation if they don't receive services
- be eligible for government-funded aged care.

Fully funded through Primary Health Networks, care finder services are free. However, the older person must give consent prior to sharing their personal information with a care finder service.

How can Wesley care finder help?

Our care finders can work with an older people to:

- access My Aged Care and arrange an assessment
- attend and provide support during the assessment
- find and shortlist local aged care providers
- complete forms, explain service agreements and conduct follow up checks
- connect with additional community services.
